1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Nonoi College stands as a symbol of the aspiration of the rural youths of greater Nonoi area for higher education. Established in the year 1985 as a result of the collective effort of a few far-sighted citizens and local people, Nonoi College struggled in the initial years as a venture college but thanks to the sacrifice, sincerity and resilience of the founding teachers and the support of the Governing Body, the college overcame all odds and was finally taken over by the government of Assam under the Assam Venture Educational Institutions (Provincialization of Services) Act, 2011 as amended 2012, came in force on 1st January 2013. Now the college is a well-established and vibrant institution which is catering to the needs of a large section of rural students for higher education.

Situated on National Highway 36 which runs between Guwahati and Silchar, the college is well connected by road with Nagaon, the nearest district Headquarters town which is 10 km away. The college provides an ideal ambience for education. The students come from families with agriculture as the chief occupation but the ambition to pursue higher education is very strong in them. The target group of the College is the rural poor, the first generation learners, the marginalized, and the women of the region in particular. The college lays emphasis on quality education with increasing enrolment of the students, especially girl students as it thinks of education as a means to unfold and express the latent potential of individuals to be achievers through learning and self-realization.

The college is affiliated to Gauhati University and it has obtained permanent affiliation for courses in Assamese, English, Economics, Political Science, Education, History and temporary affiliation for Geography, Psychology and Folklore. As an affiliated college under Gauhati University, Nonoi College got government concurrence on 1995-96. It is recognized by UGC under 2(f) and 12(b). The college is managed by a duly constituted Governing body and the Director of Higher Education, Assam is the controlling authority.

Nonoi college is a single Arts stream Under Graduate (UG) co-educational College with a larger proportion of girls .

Vision

Nonoi College envisions to establish itself as an institution of excellence and strives towards producing individuals who are knowledgeable, competent, far-sighted and sensitive to the needs of society and the environment. It further envisages to instil in them moral and ethical values, equip them with life skills and critical thinking so that they can explore their creative potential, find gainful employment and turn out to be engaged, productive, and contributing citizens for building an equitable, inclusive, and plural society as envisaged by our Constitution.

1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)

Institutional Strength

- Nonoi College, situated on National Highway 36 is well connected by road with the district headquarter town of Nagaon which is 10 k.m away, thus facilitating easy communication for students. With lush green meadows stretching from the backyards of the College to nearby villages, the College provides an eco-friendly and ideal ambience for teaching learning activities.
- The College is located in a culturally developed region of the district. So the student community is more advanced in cultural activities. Moreover the College has healthy environment for the inculcation of cultural activities.
- The College has obedient students, enthusiastic and supportive Governing Body, participative Parents, supportive local community and congenial student-teacher's relationship.
- The College has taken initiative to digitalize most of the important functioning of the College.
- With a proactive IQAC, different cells and committees are actively involved in different student centric activities.
- Participation of students in Intra and Inter University championships, many medals won.
- Empowering poor, marginalized and rural students, especially girls. Student composition consists of economically weaker sections, socially backward and the underprivileged. Among them, more than 60% are first generation learners.
- Congenial ragging-free campus for study.
- Admission process is transparent as well as diverse and inclusive and we strictly follow the rules and regulations of the Government of Assam and Gauhati University.
- A team of qualified and dedicated teaching staff concerned about the welfare of the society and a team of service minded and qualified support staff.
- Ours being a co-educational institution there is gender equality. Female students outnumber male students and thus women education and empowerment is prioritized.
- MOUs with other colleges.

Institutional Weakness

- Most of the students are of first generation higher education aspirants and therefore, lack sufficient family support from their parents.
- The College is situated in a flood affected area and during monsoon a lot of difficulties are encountered.
- Insufficient fund position is another weakness of the College. Due to lack of sufficient fund

development of the College is affected.

- The College has no hostels for students, no indoor stadium.
- Due to its rural location low rate of placement and job opportunities among the students. The College needs more vocational courses.
- Limited number of post sanctioned by the government.
- Only a few Departments have Honours course.
- No autonomy and hence limited academic flexibility.
- Very few new programs and add on courses

Institutional Opportunity

- The Governing body has an excellent vision towards upliftment and continuous development of the College.
- The College has opportunity to increase the number of MOUs and Linkages for collaboration with other institutions for faculty and student exchange programme.
- The College has the opportunity to introduce difference skill development courses and add on courses.
- The College has the opportunity to start science and commerce stream.
- The institution has wider scope for examination of its infrastructural facilities.
- The College has the opportunity for introduction of new courses like physical education and computer courses.
- Strengthening of Research opportunities for the faculty in the college.
- Modernization and strengthening of Library.

Institutional Challenge

- High rate of dropout due to poor economic condition of the parents is a challenge of the College.
- The entire area where is College is located is frequently affected by food. This hampers the uninterrupted teaching learning process of the institution.
- The College is located in a rural and backward area therefore technologically we are not that advanced till now.
- Shortage of permanent teaching staff in some subjects specially in Honours course.
- Non availability of sufficient research infrastructure is another hindrance of the College. So the College could not go forward properly in the sphere of research and development.
- Motivating students for job-friendly / skill development courses.
- To seek for financial aid from Government and other funding agencies.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

Nonoi College is affiliated to Gauhati University and is following the curriculum and academic calendar mandated by the University. The College offers B.A under graduate programme both in honours and regular courses in different subjects. The College has introduced semester system since 2011-12 session and CBCS system from the academic year 2019-20 as per the guidelines of Gauhati University.

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The academic calendar committee of the College prepares the annual College academic calendar following the Academic Calendar of the parent university and the calendar is notified prominently through the College notice board and uploaded in the website of the College.

As per affiliating university syllabus, one Sessional Examination (Internal Assessment) is conducted for every semester. The marks obtained by the students are sent to the university. The final examination is conducted by Parent University and the College has the center for the same.

The marks of Sessional Examination are recorded in the concerned department and the marks of final examination records are maintained by the office of the College.

At the very beginning of the Academic Session, IQAC organizes an Induction Programme for the newly admitted students to acquaint themselves with the CBCS courses and overall rules and regulation and environment of the College.

To facilitate experiential learning, Departmental wall magazines, College wall magazines, One ISSN magazine are published every academic year. Moreover, in most of the departments project works and field works, educational field trips and excursions are mandatory and part of the syllabus.

Various issues related to Curriculum Enrichment, Professional Ethics, Gender Equality, Human Values and Environment Awareness and Protection and sustainability are taught to the students as per parent University curriculum to ensure holistic development of the students.

Nonoi College collects regular feedback from Students, Teachers, Parents and Alumni. The feedback committee of the College analyses the feedback and prepare reports and the same is submitted to the authority for necessary action. Communication is also maintained with the students who pass out successfully and find employment in various organizations and their feedback is also sought for.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

As an affiliated College of Gauhati University, Nonoi College follows the syllabus prescribed by Gauhati University for the Under Graduate course. The College maintains transparency in the admission process. Admission takes place on the basis of merit and reservation of seats allotted as per Government of India and Government of Assam rule.

The College provides a wide range of student-centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving learning etc. by all the departments to involve the students in the teaching learning process actively.

Students are put to continuous evaluation through Class test, Group discussion, Quiz, Extempore Speech etc. to engage and motivate them effectively in the teaching learning process and assess them accordingly. The College adopts different strategies and methodologies like remedial classes, special classes on difficult topics to improve slow learners and Quiz, Debate, Seminar, Workshop, Lecture programmes etc. to encourage the advance learners.

The College follows a mechanism of transparency and efficiency for conducting internal/external assessment. The sessional examinations are conducted by respective departments as per schedule and procedure prepared by

the examination committee. If any student fails to appear in the sessional examination, provision of reexamination is there to give a chance to the students to take their Sessional Test.

In order to inculcate the social norms among the students, different community awareness programmes are organized by the College on the issue of environment, gender sensitization, road safety, women's rights, human rights etc. Besides usual classroom teaching, faculty and student exchange programme are conducted as per MOU signed with different institutions.

Research, Innovations and Extension

The College encourages research activities among faculty members and motivates the students to develop a research frame of mind. The College encourages the teachers to undertake research activities and projects.

The College has a Research Cell constituted by efficient faculties who are themselves well-versed in the area of research.

The teachers of the College are encouraged to participate in State/National/International level seminars, Orientation and Refresher Courses and many teachers of the college have attended conferences, workshops, seminars, webinars and have presented and published papers in those forums.

The College has published two ISBN books- Abhimat and Ananya in the year 2019 and 2021 respectively. The College publishes an ISSN magazine almost every academic year.

The College adopted a nearby village named Nahor Bari. Issues like hygiene and cleanliness, legal awareness, corruption and its evil have been the highlighted activities. To improve the health, hygiene and cleanliness of the village the college has organized health camps and awareness programmes.

The Extension Cell of the College organized "**Sri Krishna Ras-Leela**" in 2020, A one month Handicraft (Bamboo) Innovation Training Programme in 2021 and a seven days' workshop on DIY(Do it Yourself) in the occasion of Swaraswati Puja in 2022.

The NSS, Red Ribbon Club, Red Cross Society, Woman Cell etc organizes different programmes for the benefit of students in particular and for the benefit of the society as a whole.

Total no. of 12 MOUs have been signed with other neighboring Colleges of the district.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Nonoi College supports decentralized and participatory management system. It follows all the rules and guidelines of the affiliating university, UGC and the State Government for employment, admission, utilization of funds, maintaining discipline and overall management. The governing body of the College is constituted as per Assam Government and UGC guidelines and approved from the State Government. The governing body of the College meets on a regular basis to discuss the issues relating to the overall development of the College.

The Principal cum Secretary is the administrative head of the institution in administrative and financial matters. The Principal is vested with the responsibility of managing the day-to-day functioning of the College affairs.

The Principal is assisted by HoDs and other teaching and non-teaching staff. The Librarian coordinates all the affairs of the Library.

To facilitate overall administration of the College, different cells and committees are constituted and are entrusted with various responsibilities. These committees hold regular meetings and the proceedings are properly recorded and the programme of action is executed.

The IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell) is also an important unit that has been formed to assist and execute administrative and academic tasks for the overall functioning of the College in determining quality education.

Internal audit is conducted annually by College appointed and Government certified Charter Accountant and utilization certificates are submitted on regular basis.

The College follows satisfactory performance appraisal system for carrier advancement of the faculty members.

Student Support and Progression

An educational institution has to provide needful assistance for its students for their holistic development and progression. Nonoi College goes all out to provide the best facilities and academic support to its students.

Aspiring Student have been benefited by various scholarships, sponsored by state and central government and fee-waiver schemes which are made available to the socially- economically disadvantaged students, including OBC, S.T, Minority community and girl students. The meritorious students are covered under Ishan Uday scholarship scheme.

The college has constituted Grievance Redressal Cell, Anti-Ragging committee and Internal Compliant committee which keeps a strict vigil to ensure a free and healthy environment for women in the campus.

For the last five years, the students have shown satisfactory performance in the university examination and other competitive examinations, have got admitted in different state and central Universities and a god no of students got jobs in Government and Private Sectors.

The college organizes events, competitions in the field of sports, cultural and literacy aspects .Students of Nonoi college participates in various inter district and inter college sports competition and co-curricular activities. The College provide uniform equipments, dietary supplement and bears the expenses of the sports person in various competitions both in the district and outside the district. The institution also promotes NSS program where large number of students are involved. The institution has been winning prizes at inter college competitions.

The institution organizes various awareness programmes on stress management, health & hygiene, etc.

The institution has taken capacity building & skill enhancement initiations from time to time like Soft skills, life skills etc. Programme on ICT/computing skills are also organized by the college.

The college has a registered alumni association which is active and considered as the strongest support system for the existing students. The Alumni Association of the college provides extensive support for the present students in the areas like extension activities, admission process, in cleanliness of the college campus.

Governance, Leadership and Management

Nonoi College is situated on National Highway 36 which is 10km away from Nagaon Town. With lush green meadows stretching from the back- yards of the College to nearby villages there is an ideal ambiance for education. The College has a beautiful campus of 5.198 acres of land. Total build up area is 2350.275 square metre. The College has adequate physical facilities for teaching-learning. There are two multi-storied and a few single-storied buildings comprising Principal's Room, IQAC Conference Room, Office Rooms, Classrooms, Departmental Rooms, Computer Lab, Library, 3 number of Practical Rooms namely- Geography Practical Room, Psychology Practical Room and Education Practical Room. There are also Girls Common Room, Student Union Room in the College.

The College has Wi-Fi facilities in the campus. Clean drinking water facilities and Canteen are available for both Students and Teachers.

The Central Library of the College is named after Founder President of Nonoi College Dina Nath Bora and it is named the Dina Nath Bora Library. There are 3870 number of text books and reference books. The Library is automated with ILMS Soul 3.0 of INFLIBNET. It has NLIST, DELNET and NDLI accessibility facilities. Besides, the library has regular subscriptions to newspapers, periodicals, research journal etc. Question papers of previous years are also available in the Library.

The College encourages games and sports and students hold regular practice of their favourite sports. There are good numbers of equipments and facilities for different kinds of games and sports such as Cricket, Volleyball, Football, Badminton, Carrom etc.

For the purpose of infrastructure development the College follows the Master Plan and the rules and guidelines of governing body and Government of Assam. The governing body prepares plans and estimates for the purpose of construction and repairing of buildings. There is also a construction committee and a purchase committee at the implementation level.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

Nonoi College endeavours to be responsive to the emerging challenges and pressing issues. It emphasizes on basic human values and respect for the environment. The code of conduct of the College is published in the prospectus as well as in College website. The college has organized a number of programmes - academic and extra curriculum activities to create an atmosphere of harmony, unity and integrity in society at large.

The College has active Grievance Redressal Cell, Anti Ragging Committee and Internal Complaint Committee (Anti Sexual Harassment Cell) for redressal of respective issues raised by the students and faculties.

The College maintains a clean and green campus. Separate Bins are kept at different places on the campus to reduce waste to the lower extent.

The College has done its green audit, environment and energy audit for its self analysis and development.

The institution celebrates various National and International, commemorative days and events and organizes programmes to sensitize students and employs on their constitutional obligations.

The College has identified certain practices as Best Practices and follows these practices sincerely. First best practice of the College is "Shaping Mental Health Fitness for the future" and the second best practice is "Community-Student Integration for Preserving Socio-Cultural Traditions through Raslila Celebrations" related to the cultural tradition of Sri Krishna Ras-Leela. The result of the two best practices is very positive. A good relationship is built through these practices with the neighborhood communities.

Curriculum focusses on multi-disciplinary subjects. Our College is imparting education in the Arts stream only. At present, the students are able to make individual choices for any subject from those presently available in the college. The College has forwarded a proposal to the Government of Assam to introduce Commerce stream and the approval of the same is expected to be obtained soon. As interdisciplinary action, the institution has signed MOU with other Colleges. Several training programmes of one week duration have been conducted. The institution organised several conferences, workshops, seminars at national and College level. Our College is making all necessary preparations in terms of infrastructure, academic and all other relevant resources to implement the provisions of NEP 2020 in Multi-disciplinary Programmes and Interdisciplinary Courses and we are waiting for the nod from our affiliating University as well as the government of Assam. 2. 1.1.1 The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning and delivery through a well-planned and documented process including Academic calendar and conduct of continuous internal Assessment

Response:

- i. Nonoi college is affiliated to Gauhati University, Guwahati, Assam and the college follows the curriculum and academic Calendar offered by the University.
- ii. Nonoi College implemented Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in 2019 in all the departments as per the regulations of Gauhati University, Guwahati. The college has constantly endeavored to follow the curriculum within its established academic structures for the holistic development of its students.
- iii. IQAC conducts a meeting at the beginning of every Academic Year to follow up the syllabi of each subject and an Annual Academic Calendar of the college is prepared by the academic committee every year on the basis of academic calendar of the Gauhati University.
- iv. In the beginning of each academic session, the IQAC organizes an Induction programme for the fresh students to acquaint themselves with the overall academic activities and environment of the college. The academic committee of the college looks after the academic environment of the college and takes care for imparting quality education to students.
- v. The prospectus designed by the prospectus committee disseminates information regarding the programmes and courses. The details of programme outcomes, programme specific outcomes, course outcomes, syllabi, weightage of internal and external examinations and other relevant rules, regulations and information are communicated through the prospectus and also uploaded on the college website.
- vi. The college follows the academic calendar of Gauhati University and to ensure effective implementation and timely completion of syllabus offered by the Gauhati University, the Academic Council periodically monitors the Progress. The routine committee headed by the principal of the college draws a detailed timetable for smooth functioning of the classes.
- vii. The head of each department distributes/circulates allocation of classes at departmental level on the basis of the general routine framed by the IQAC.
- viii. Most of the teachers adopt modern technological teaching learning methods besides the conventional lecture methods to deliver the courses to the students. In response to the timeline given by the Gauhati University every department of the college arranges unit tests and sessional examination for each paper as per tentative dates specified in the academic calendar.
- ix. Every department of the college gives home assignment to the students as a part of their internal assessments. The students are informed well in advance about the deadline for assignment submission, through College Notice board and through Departments.

- Curriculum Enrichment: The College has always been sensitive towards crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and sustainability in the curriculum. Being an affiliated college, the college follows the curriculum of Gauhati University and it integrates more or less, all the above mentioned issues. Orientation at Departmental Level:

- To make all the students aware about the Continuous Internal Evaluation process of the college in the very beginning of every Academic session.
- The sample of previous year question papers and answer copies are shown to the students departmentally.
- Departmental wise Unit Test & Sessional Examinations are conducted.
- Home Assignments are given to the students as per affiliated university syllabus.

Mechanism to deal with internal examination related Grievance Redressal of Nonoi College for improving students' wellbeing at college as stated below-

The academic activities are supplemented by non- academic aspects including mentoring, counselling, remedial programs and motivational training sessions for the holistic development of the students.

The College has a well organised administrative structure and the supreme authority is the Governing Body. The Governing Body of the college which meets at a regular intervals in a year to discuss different issues relating to finance, infrastructure, faculty requirement and the matters related to the overall development of the college. The highest authority of the College, i.e. the President of the Governing Body is selected from among the educationist of the area and he is appointed by the Director of Higher Education, Assam. It recommends Strategic Plan in respect of development of infrastructure, quality improvement in teaching learning process and good practices.

The Principal cum secretary (Governing Body) of the college is the key person having executing authority of each and every attains of the institution. Assist by HoD, the staff council, non-teaching staff which comprises of senior assistant and junior office assistant and other members of the institution.

Hods regulate departmental activities and regularly discuss issues relating to curricular and extra-curricular activities. The staff council meetings are held regularly for the effective planning and implementation programme like teaching-learning, academic, administration, curricular and extra-curricular activities.

The teaching staff unit and non-teaching staff take tremendous measures implementation the Strategic Plans and sometimes also take decision in view of various affairs of the college. It offers suggestions in development of different aspects of the institution.

- Internal audit is done at the end of every financial year through a college appointed Chartered Accountant.
- Auditors access and verify the collection of fees and other all income sources.
- Voucher based payments are verified, based on Supporting Documents and Bank reconciliation statements.
- Bank transactions are checked and verified subsequently.
- Any form of discrepancy is discussed with the management.
- All the financial Transaction are accounted based on financial statements like cash-balance sheets and income and expenditure account for the financial year.

Best Practice: 1

Title: Shaping Mental Health Fitness for the Future

Objectives:

- To enhance the state of mental health and increase access to healthcare.
- To Raise awareness.
- To help those with a condition to overcome the stigma and get access to treatment.
- To help loved ones of the person affected to better understand his/her condition
- To help people recognize the ways in which mental illness impacts their lives.
- To educates people about available services
- To encourage those who are suffering to seek help

Context:

Mental health is a great concern worldwide. Stigma and discrimination against people living with mental disorders affects one's education, employment, and access to care. Suicide, Drugs addictions, unemployment, anxiety about the future and the post covid 19 scenerio add up to the seriousness of the phenomenon. This was the immediate context and thus, Mental Health Camp becomes now a need to address issues of mental health and also stimulating easy and applied interventions within the community and college campus.

Practice:

Students today experiencing mental health problems are on the rise. As mental health and academic success in college go hand in hand, each year twice a session the team of Psychology department of Nonoi College have conducted free Mental Health Camp. A Mental Health camp was organized outside to spread awareness, health check-ups and maintaining a mentally healthy life for the local people and for all the students and staff of the college .In every session the camp started at morning with the inaugural speech given by one of our respected teacher and Head of the team. By 9am all students were asked to make a line and get the questionnaire forms. By 1 pm every student with staff got themselves checked.

Evidence of Success:

After interpretation of scores, those in need of counselling were given one to one counselling, and further referrals, if required, were done by the mental health professionals. A huge number of participants walked in the camp .The results from inventories were later analysed and reported.

Result:

The analysis of inventories showed that most of the sessions more than 60% respondents had 50% probability of developing major stress induced health problems in the near future and more than 1/3rd participants had moderate level of stress. The camp helped in dispelling the stigma associated with talking about one's mental health and consolidated the belief that it is okay to talk about one's mental health.

Problems encountered and Resource Required

The main barriers -

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- Limited availability of mental health education and awareness
- Difficult to recognize symptoms of mental illness
- Social stigma
- Person's own beliefs
- The risk of facing discrimination in cultural, social, and professional circles .
- Racial barriers to mental health care access and treatment.

Notes:

Encouraging awareness and education through national and local campaigns can help change public perceptions of mental health illness and dissolve those barriers to treatment. Mental Health Camps offer a potential encouragement to local community and utilise the available resources to identify, counsel or refer people with mental health issues. More such camps at periodic intervals will be conducted in the college and the neighbourhood.

Best Practice: 2

Title: Community-Student Integration for Preserving Socio-Cultural Traditions through Raslila Celebrations

Objective:

- To spread cultural consciousness.
- To preserve the medieval Dance and Drama (Ankiya nat of Saint Sankardev).
- To generate interest towards traditional performing arts.
- To bring together rural performing artists and students together.
- To create vibrant, socially-engaged, and cooperative communities according to NEP.

Context:

Nagaon is a culturally vibrant place and its puranic and historical significance is attested by the fact that the 'Purana' famous Champavati, Kandali State and famous Kachari King Maha Manikya and The Assamese Ramayana maker Madhav Kandali have glaring references to Nonoi. Nonoi College being the only HEI enjoys the privileges of preserving the rich cultural legacy of the place and continues its efforts to take the residents of this area towards a healthy social direction.

Practice:

Maintaining the continuity from 2016 to 2022, the college has been able to conduct the programme in various Namghar of Nagaon. Especially in 2020 the students and employees of Nonoi College have been able to get appreciation by performing plays in an exhibition in the college premises with the active cooperation of teaching staff. Every year the college has been participating in Ras Leela in different parts of the region as well as in the state and has been cooperating in public relations and social progress. For example Kandali Bapu Gusai Than, Royal Fitness Club, Nonoi College etc. Using impressive sound and visual medium have an intense communication potential to render traditional themes in to contemporary relevance.

Evidence of Success:

Under the guidance of Dr. Basanta Bora, Assistant Professor, Assamese Department. Nonoi College, the students have been participating in Ras Leela to keep the traditional of spiritual environment of the region alive with a sense of social responsibility and duty, i.e. to carry the sacred stream of bhaona culture. Apart from this, one of the main aspects is the fact that the devotional songs of played in Ras Leela, titled "Krishna Kanai" by Dr. Basanta Bora, have been able to win the hearts of the audience through the region as well as through various media.

Problems:

- The younger generation's reluctance towards the "Raslila of Sri Krishna".
- The elderly are incapable of train up the new generation.
- Lack of interest in learning training techniques verbally.
- Directors had to be invited from other places due to the demise of directors.
- Due to Floods and the post Covid-19 scenario the villagers do not have the capacity to hold such cultural events.
- Parents do not involve their only child in those activities.
- Dysfunctional cultural environment.

Notes

To maintain peace and order in the society by reviving the rising generation of Nonoi region composed of different castes and tribes with spiritual consciousness.

To give people a taste of spiritual songs and unique Assamese dances by making them interested in the purana famous Krishna culture. Engaging indigenous artists in traditional Bhaona art. To reduce youth discipline.

Nonoi College's Theatrical Journey:

A saga of Success

Nonoi College is a higher education institution which is deeply embedded in the ethos of the place of its location and it is alive to the rich cultural heritage and vibrant spirit of its neighbourhood.

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Culture can be summed up as "the way of life for an entire society." As such, it includes codes of manners, dress, language, religion, rituals, art. norms of behavior, such as law and morality, and systems of belief. Culture enhances our quality of life and increases overall well-being for both individuals and communities.

Performing arts like theatre and drama have a direct appeal to the common mass and serve as a potent communication medium to convey a socio-cultural message.

One of the distinctive feature of Nonoi College is the excellent role of it's students and faculties in promoting theatre and drama and spreading the message of culture, harmony and ethical values.

Being involved in theatre productions and classes demands commitment and motivation. The involvement of our students in theatre work teaches them how to work effectively and cooperatively with different types of people for the production to success. Theatre teaches them the importance of rules, enhances their ability to grasp complex matters in a short period of time, teaches them to willingly accept and respect authority and to have confidence in themselves, thus enabling them to handle a variety of jobs, pressures, difficulties and responsibilities. It also helps them develop the confidence that's essential to speaking clearly, lucidly, and thoughtfully. Acting onstage teaches them how to be comfortable speaking in front of large audiences.

The college has been giving importance to the students to develop their performing talents in theatre in parallel with their academic aspects.

The main objective of this theatrical performance is to develop artistic thinking as well as make them aware of their social responsibility.

Nonoi College has been creating an atmosphere congenial to the promotion of theatre since its inception. Students of Nonoi college participated in the Ekank Natak competition at the Inter-College Youth Festival of Gauhati University in the year 2012 with the play "Kareng Bepir Hanhi" written by Biplab Jyoti Bhuyan and won the Best Drama Team Award. Assistant Professor Kalyan Nath won the Best Director Award while students Bidyut Kumar Nath won the Best Villain Award, Gagan Jyoti Barbora won the third best actor award and Arunima Bora won the second best actress award respectively. It is to be noted that a student of Nonai College, Bidyut Kumar Nath, fascinated the audience by his acting talent and he was awarded the "Khalnayak" award for the first time in the history of Gauhati University's Youth Festival.

Maintaining the continuity of the dramatic trend, later on, Surya Bara Sonwarani of Biswanath Chariali, Bishnu Rabha Sonwarani of Chatia, Debendranath Acharya Sonwarani of Duliajan, Yogeshwar Baruah Sonwarani of Bihpuria, Srishti Natya Samaj of Kapahera, Surabhi Sahitya Sabha of Nagaon, Mukut Mani Saikia Sonwarani; Kamapar's Aarohan Ekank Natak Competition managed to win various awards like Best Team, Best Actor, Best Director, Best Comedian etc.

One of the strong steps that Nanai College has taken in the field of theatre is the staging of Jyotiprasad Bhuyan's play "Amrityu-Amrit" by renowned story writer Shivananda Kakati of Assam. In collaboration with the teachers and staff and students of Nonoi College as well as professor Sadananda Payeng of Anandram Dhekial Phukan College in Nagaon and Ajit Bhadali and dignitaries of Nonai area, the successful performance of "Amrityu-Amrit" has been held in Nagaon District Library, Ban Theatre of Tezpur, Shivsagar Natyamandir etc. drawing huge applaud and appreciation from the spectators. Apart from this, in the year 2014 at the Youth Festival's Satire Drama Competition of Gauhati University, the students of Nonoi College brought laurels to the college by securing the second position with the play

"Facebook". Nonoi College rose to fame in the year 2015 by organizing "Folk Artist Late Bharat Das Sonwarani" drama show in Nagaon District Library focussing on the theme of "social responsibility" as well as performing plays in that program. In the year 2015, at the initiative of Nonai College, a solo performance by former student Bidyut Kumar Nath, made an unprecedented contribution to the college's theatrical journey when he performed the Monodrama "Makarajal" written and directed by Jyotiprasad Bhuyan. So popular was the performance that he was requested to repeat the performance at Nagaon Girls' College, Anandram Dhekial Phukan College, Lakhimpur District Library etc.

In the cultural programmes of the newcomer receptions of 2018-2019, 2019-2020 and 2020-2021, the students presented short plays on different aspects of the reality of contemporary society. He played a role in maintaining the cultural atmosphere of Nonai College by successfully performing the play "Tikhar aru Suti Bai & Tejimala" play on environmental protection. In the Gauhati University Inter-College Mandalik Youth Festival held in 2021-2022 and in Tyagbir Hembarua College in Sonitpur district he participated and secured the third position in the satirical drama titled Social Media.

The college has strived to revive and maintain the rich theatrical traditions of Assam in a dynamic way and there is a reason to think that this theatrical journey will inspire the cultural talent of the students and contribute to the cultural enrichment of our society in the future.
